# Senior School Academic Awards Ceremony

On Thursday morning, 21 February, we invited boys and parents to attend an Academic Awards Ceremony to acknowledge boys currently in Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12 who had shown excellent results in their 2018 year. Well done to all our prize winners.



The IGCSE results of the Grade 10 boys of 2018 are something to celebrate. 80% of all symbols were C or better. This year the top performing subject was Physical Science with 41 distinctions followed by Mathematics with 36 distinctions, English Language with 30 distinctions and Biology with 24 distinctions. 25 boys received academic badges for achieving four or more distinctions.


#### **Scrummies Pink Drive**
