The Saints travelled across the tollgate for the second consecutive weekend, this time to challenge old rivals, DHS. While the hosts notched up a number of good wins on the basketball court, the Saints cricket teams were in fine form, winning 9 out of 10 the games played. The Saints 1<sup>st</sup> team cricket and basketball both performed well and the respective head coaches, Murray Cole-Edwardes and Darren Holcomb, reported on the games as follows:

## SAINTS CRICKET VS DHS

The 1<sup>st</sup> XI continued their magnificent form with the bat, amassing a huge total of 282/5 against DHS on the Theobald Oval. Ntando Zuma and Panashe Taruvinga settled the ship after a shaky start, putting on a 50 partnership for the 3<sup>rd</sup> wicket. After Zuma fell for 35, it brought captain Raw to the crease and he showed yet again why he is one of the premier players in the province.



His 102 off just 85 balls took the game away from DHS and put the Saints firmly in control after the first innings. However, whilst Raw deserves all the plaudits for his stroke play, it was Taruvinga who controlled one end and played an innings of conviction and maturity, especially for a Grade 10. His 81 off 112 balls was a privilege to watch and this U19 international player will have a bright future if he continues to play more innings of this nature.

DHS, in reply, always had a steady run rate whilst St Charles College set attacking fields, and although the run rate was always hovering around the 5-per-over mark, wickets fell at regular intervals and the Saints were never really in danger. The pick of the bowlers for the visitors was young fast bowler, Ross Ritchie, who returned figures of 4 wickets for 33 runs in 9 overs. The Saints will feel they should have ended the game with a bit more precision. Some poor fielding and sloppy death bowling meant DHS only fell 38 runs short. All in all, this was a great away performance from the Saints 1<sup>st</sup> XI and, with half-term looming, we wish the boys attending final KwaZulu-Natal Inland trials all the best.

Highlights from the other matches included some excellent bowling from Asande Nduku (6/21) for the 4<sup>th</sup> XI, Joel Reynard (5/10) for the U15Bs, Riav Gayadin (5/15) for the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI, Timothy Schoeman (4/25) for the U15As and Caleb Gladman (4/26) for the U14A team. On the batting front, inspired by 1<sup>st</sup> XI

performances this season from Raw, Zuma, Wassenaar and Taruvinga, Mpilo Gambu scored his second 50 of the season (U15B). Marcel Wellmann and Paulo de Franca continued their good form for the U15As and 2<sup>nd</sup> XI respectively, Ryan Preston scored his maiden half century (4<sup>th</sup> XI), while Lwandle Mzila top scored for the U14As with 50.

We look forward to playing Glenwood after half-term, fixtures details are already **AVAILABLE ON SOCS**.

Last week our 1<sup>st</sup> XI cricket team travelled to Pretoria to compete in the prestigious, Independent Schools Cricket Festival. With three days of Cricket to be played, each with a different format, it always promised to be a valuable time. On day one, we played a 50 over game against the hosts, WHPS (Waterkloof House Preparatory School). They batted first and amassed a total of 270 runs. Our boys did not give up and batted superbly, but ultimately fell just short on 250 runs. It was a great game of cricket by the two Prep schools.



On day two, which was a timed game, SCC won the toss and asked Beaulieu to bat. Bowling a superb line and length, we managed to bowl them out for 140 runs. The SCC boys passed the total and went on to make 220 runs, declaring with a lead of 80 runs. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> innings, we needed to take 5 wickets for the outright win and only managed 3 to ensure we won on the first innings.

On day three, a T20, the SCC boys produced one of the greatest comebacks I have ever seen on a cricket field. Only scoring 96 runs, the Saints bowlers needed to be at their best. Pridwin Preparatory School raced to 60/2 after 7 overs. At 68/3 we needed a special performance. Bringing on our two leg spinners changed the game in our favour with our "leggies" getting 6 – 21 between them. We bowled them out for 89 to win by 7 runs. 

# GRADE 9 PHYSICAL SCIENCE

The Grade 9s have been busy studying metal reactivity during their Physical Science lessons.

In experiments, the boys analysed how different metal carbonates decomposed. The metal carbonate was heated and the carbon dioxide was liberated. The boys timed how long it took for the limewater to go milky from the carbon dioxide and this informed them of the reaction rate of each reaction.

Another experiment was done using metals and reacting them with sulfuric acid to see if the reactivity of the metals changed for a different experiment or stayed the same. – Mrs Claire Beckedahl

The Technology department has given their Grade 9 students the task of designing and building an 'unsinkable' recycled plastic bottle boat which must be no longer than 2m and 1.5 m wide.

They also needed to create a portfolio explaining their name choice, colour coding and design. The test involved getting four out of the five team members across the pool and back in as few pieces as possible,

and as quickly as possible.
