

Cyracle 11 HISTORY EXCURSION





The Grade 11 History students went with Mrs Joubert on a History excursion on the Monday, 15 November to some Durban museums.

They visited the Denis Hurley centre alongside the Emmanuel Cathedral and saw the amazing work they are doing there. The current centre is a dynamic, living memorial to Denis Hurley.

The Saints boys also visited the Durban naval museum where they learnt about the various changes made to the Durban harbour over the years and the history of whaling in South Africa. They got to climb aboard a ship and see for themselves what it was like inside.



Then they went to the Kwa Muhle Museum and were given a talk by the curator Mr Steve Kotze. He spoke about the history of apartheid in Durban and how segregation and the pass laws operated during that time in South Africa and in Durban. The SCC boys then went to the Durban Art Gallery where there was a contemporary exhibition of photographs by artists such as Cedric Nunn. Whilst in the same building they visited the Durban Natural Science Museum which has many interesting artefacts to see.

The last stop was to visit was to the Denis Hurley centre in Durban. Archbishop Hurley attended St Charles College many years ago and it was fitting that the boys learnt about him and his legacy. The centre relies totally on donations and does excellent work with the community outreach programmes that they run for the homeless in Durban. Two hundred people are fed every day, with showers the homeless can use and a computer centre with the internet, a refugee crisis centre and a clinic with medical professionals. The boys were shown around the centre by one of the managers Jean-Marie and then went to visit the Emmanuel Cathedral which is currently being renovated.

It was a very thought provoking and interesting day, reflecting on the past and thinking about the future.

LUNCH WITH THE LANGUAGE INSTITUTE


On Wednesday, 17 November the KwaZulu-Natal Language Institute (KLI) held a multi-cultural lunch at the Coach House.




MEASURING OBJECTS IN


