


As is becoming tradition, our war cry leaders generated some energy and the assembly closed with, "All my Saints Boys".

Game Day VS CLIFTON

St Charles College played their annual fixture against Clifton College on Saturday. It was an excellent day of schoolboy sport, mainly played at Riverside, where Clifton and the Saints locked horns in 32 fixtures from under 9 through to the Senior School 1st team hockey and rugby. Adding to the occasion was the celebration of Clifton's Founders Day.

It was a great day for rugby with perfect winter conditions in Durban. St Charles College had a good morning with the majority of the Senior School rugby fixtures going the way of the Pietermaritzburg teams. The 1st XV game was always lining up to be a very tight encounter and it didn't disappoint the large crowd who had gathered for the 3pm kick off.

Clifton managed to score first with their tighthead prop diving over for the 1st try.

Soon after, Saints left wing Naghan Watts, scored an unbelievable individual try. The game stayed deadlocked at 5-all for a long period until the 8th man from Clifton dived over early in the 2nd half. St Charles College replied in the dying minutes of the game to make it 17 – 10 to the hosts.

On a hockey front, the two 1st teams squared up in front of full stands of supporters. The excitement and energy played its role for the home team as Clifton started the game incredibly well, while the Saints players were slow to find rhythm. This resulted in an early goal for the hosts which was powerfully struck into the top corner, followed by two shorties in quick succession which both resulted in drag flick goals. Not a great start for the boys in blue and gold, but things turned around in the second chukka. The Saints started to control the tempo of the game and managed to keep possession for longer periods. Both teams managed to create further chances, but their defences had both stone-walled and no further goals were added; final score being 3 - 0 to the hosts.


The project was a great way for the Grade 9s to develop not only their cars but also their skills in design and development. – Ethan Laight (Grade 9)
