The Saints closed out their winter sports season last weekend with matches in Johannesburg against St Benedict's. The age group 'A' teams and both hockey and rugby 1st teams managed to safely negotiate the N3 and thoroughly enjoyed the final winter fixtures for 2022.

HOCKEY

There were good games all round with the U14As overturning a 3-1 loss from when they played earlier in the year, to a 2-1 win. This was testament to how much they have developed as individuals, and as a team, as the season

progressed. The U16As ended their season with a stellar performance and a 3-0 win. This also marked the first hat-trick of the season with all three goals coming off the stick of Muhammed Moola.

The 1st team game was an intense affair with both teams playing with lots of energy. This resulted in some lapses in concentration and rash tackles from the SCC players, who were in turn awarded

cards. This changed the course of the 1st chukka and made life difficult for the *Blue and Gold*. The second chukka started the same way; with SCC still a player down, it was difficult for the visitors to gain any real momentum. St Charles College did well to hold out and keep St Benedict's at bay, who were unable to capitalise on the long period with an extra player advantage. Going into half time, the score remained 0 – 0.

When SCC were back at full strength, the control of the game shifted, and St Benedict's were on the backfoot for long periods.

They were, however, still dangerous on the





breaks and had several skilful players that were and able to force outcomes when they got close to the circle. The two contrasting styles of play between the two schools made for an exciting encounter.

Going into the 4^{th} quarter, the scores were still level. Passion and the will to win was on the rise which turned it to a more heated affair. St Charles College continued to control the game with St Benedict's still looking dangerous on the counter. Both teams had missed opportunities and the SCC keeper doing extremely well, meant neither team were able to take the lead, although it seemed a certainty that one would score. However, neither St Charles College nor St Benedict's managed the feat and the game ended in a 0-0 stalemate.





RUGBY

Although the boys in Blue and Gold have travelled to Grahamstown for the Independent Schools Festival this week, the hosts, and Matrics in particular, took to the main field for the final time. This added meaning and emotion to the occasion and resulted in a tense affair. The home team were first on the board, through a penalty kick, and much of the first half was equal in terms of possession. St Charles College took the lead after 15 minutes when pivot, Patrick de Villiers, sliced through the defence to go in untouched next to the uprights. The Maritzburg boys remained in front for the remainder of the game, their lineouts were clinical, and this set a great attacking platform. Matthew Urquhart continued his scintillating form, controlling maul drives to score two tries, while outside backs Luke Ferreira and Jehan Adonis also got onto the scoresheet, finishing off some great interplay. St Benedict's stayed in the fight and scored a good try through some solid phases of play which began with a quick penalty tap. The home team were well-coached and the visitors from KZN had to stay focussed to avoid a late Bennies surge. The final whistle blew with the scoreboard reading 29 – 21 in favour of SCC.





The age group teams enjoyed a perfect end to the winter season, with the U14A, U15A and U16A all winning their matches. The juniors put on a try scoring exhibition, running the ball from all over the field, while the U16As came through a tighter contest, winning in the end by 7 points. 








Our Grade 4s have just finished "The Sheep Pig" set book and the boys designed their own book covers to end off their book study.
