

### CUP WINNERS - CLIFTON RUGBY SEVENS TOURNAMENT

Ending second in our pool, all was not lost as we got another chance at the Cup playing Michaelhouse's 1<sup>st</sup> team in the quarterfinals. It was a great win for the boys in *Blue and Gold*, 12 – 7, which lined up a semi-final against



Kearsney's 1<sup>st</sup> team. The boys from Pietermaritzburg found their rhythm and played very well to win 22 – 12.

The last game of the day was against Westville's 1<sup>st</sup> team, who edged out Hilton in their semi-final by winning 19 - 17 in the last minute of the game. In the final, Westville scored first, and the Saints replied immediately from the kick-off, to score and make it 7 - 7. Westville scored again and went into the break leading 14 - 7. Straight after halftime, the Saints scored in the corner after several phases, but couldn't convert, making it 12 - 14. The rest of the second half was a great display of Sevens Rugby. # GRADE 9 History EXCURSION

On Thursday, 27 July, our Grade 9 History class, along with Mrs Joubert and Mr Strydom, went to a battle site of the South African War or Anglo Boer War, which was fought from 1899 – 1902.

After our arrival we were introduced to our guide Mr Raymond Herron, who took us to the top of Mount Alice, from where you can see Spionkop. He told us about why the many events that happened then shaped South African history in a very interesting and informative talk.

After a break we went to the battle site of Spionkop and drove to the top of the

hill. We learnt that the British were disorganized during the battle, employed the wrong tactics in the situation and took devastating casualties. Ghandhi was a stretcher bearer for the British and was part of the Indian volunteer transport corps, and Winston Churchill was also part of the battle. The dead British soldiers were buried in mass graves. The battle was a victory for the Boers however both sides took heavy casualties.

One of the most important lessons we learnt that day

is that the Boer War wasn't a war between the Boers and the British but South Africa against Britain. Many people in South Africa and other parts of the world came to fight against the British.

We are very grateful to Mr and Mrs Herron, the owners of the Spionkop Lodge, who showed us their hospitality and showcased the amazing history in the area they reside in. – Lethokuhle Sibiya (Grade 9)


# 100 DAYS OF School


