

MATHEMATICS CAMBRIDGE AS LEVEL RESULT

Keeping the tradition of excellent achievement, following the three boys who achieved 97% in 2022, Nikhil edged closer to the elusive obtaining an exceptional 98% for his AS Level Mathematics examination in the June series. Nikhil will continue with the A2 semester of his A Levels in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Further Mathematics to be written in November, and is still deciding between Medicine or Engineering for his tertiary studies next year.








SENIOR PRIMARY MUSIC RECITAL


