#### FOOTBALL VS CLIFTON

The boys in *Blue and Gold* had to chase the game, and captain Rèarden Dicken found space and beat two defenders to score in the bottom left-hand corner.

With Clifton under pressure and playing a very deep defensive line, it was the Saints who drew level when referee Gary Crous pointed to the penalty spot after an illegal challenge in the box. Dicken made no mistake from the spot, sending the 'keeper the wrong way. With both teams running out of time, St Charles College won a throw-in deep in Clifton territory and a long throw from Caleb Ryland saw Thabiso Ndlela put the finishing touches on a spectacular comeback; St Charles College winning 3 – 2.


