

First XV Rugby Tour

Over the Easter break, the St Charles College First XV embarked on a memorable rugby tour to Johannesburg, hosted by St Stithians College. The tour provided not only a competitive platform against quality opposition from around the country but also served as an excellent opportunity for team bonding and development.



Match 1: St Charles College vs Windhoek High School

The opening fixture saw the First XV take on Windhoek High School in a game that truly was a tale of two halves. Opting to start with a young and relatively inexperienced lineup, the team displayed impressive composure and skill in the first half, keeping the scoreline close and showing immense promise.

In the second half, the "bomb squad" brought a new level of intensity, dominating proceedings and scoring 31 points in just 30 minutes to seal a convincing 38 – 22 victory. The match highlighted

Standout performances came from Eben Crafford, who scored a hat-trick of tries, as well as Rafael Ajibade, who brought immense physicality, forward momentum, and on-field leadership. AJ Bosman, recently returned from injury, controlled the game superbly and added a layer of experience that proved crucial in the second-half surge.

Match 2: St Charles College vs St Andrew's College

The second fixture presented a formidable challenge against St Andrew's College – one of the top 20 rugby schools in the country. Despite being without two key players due to injury, the boys approached the match with confidence and determination.

After trailing 19 – 0 at halftime, the team produced a spirited comeback, scoring 14 unanswered points in the second half to finish just short, 19 – 14. The performance demonstrated the squad's resilience, heart, and commitment to representing the school with pride. It was a performance that, while not reflected in the final score, earned the respect of all watching.

The tour was not just about the rugby – it was also about building camaraderie, leadership, and team culture. 


